

Information for Students Attending a Palmer/Pletsch Learn to Sew Jackets Workshop

Here is a typical schedule, the optional shopping trip and color analysis, and a list of what to bring.

Our “ideal suggested schedule” while you are here is to arrive the day before the workshop and get settled into the hotel. Remember, the hotel will pick you up at the airport. You need to call when you get your luggage. When you make your reservations, don’t forget to tell the hotel you are a Palmer/Pletsch student so you can get your special room rate. When you arrive at the hotel, you might want to walk to a nearby store to stock your room refrigerator with a few snacks and drinks. Our local water is wonderful, FYI, so bottled water is just an option, but not very “green.” Also, the hotel has a lovely, reasonable restaurant.

The hotel is near a major fashion shopping mall and you may want check it out. Nordstrom is a very good place to be fitted for a bra if you’ve never had that done before, especially if you are full busted.

If it has been years since you’ve had your colors done or if you never have, Ethel Harms is an amazing image consultant who has developed her own color and cosmetic line. This is not a “canned” color palette, as Ethel hand builds your palette according to your hair, eyes, and skin colors. If you make an appointment with her the day or evening before the workshop, she will bring you your color palette two days later and show you how to shop with it. Or, book with her any available evening during the workshop.

Ethel will give you the names of the others (up to 4) who have signed up at the same time and you can contact each other and cab to her studio about 15 minutes from the hotel. Palmer/Pletsch **Tailoring** Vacation Schedule 5-DAY WORKSHOP

Day 1:

Bring to class: Your altered jacket pattern, fabric, and interfacing (if you have already purchased them). Do not bring your sewing machine the first day. The goal on Day One is to cut, fuse and pin-fit your jacket. Please eat breakfast provided by the hotel before boarding the shuttle van.

8:45 am The hotel will shuttle you to class at the Fabric Depot. (Ask driver for schedule for rest of workshop. It will probably be 8:15 except on Sundays)
9:00 am Introductions and announcements
9:45 am Class begins.
12:30 pm Lunch
1:30 pm Class continues.
6:00 pm The van will take you back to the hotel.

Day 2-5

The hotel will shuttle you to class at the Fabric Depot.

9:00 am Class begins.
12:30 pm Lunch
1:30 pm Class continues.
6:00 pm Days 2-4 the van will shuttle you back to the hotel.
5:00 pm Day 5 the van will shuttle you back to the hotel.
6:00 pm Day 5 Carpool graduation dinner.

Bring the Following:

Fabric. Quality 100% wool crepe, flannel, gabardine, or tweed for your jacket. (Please bring ½ yd. extra to test interfacings and for making test samples. For those allergic to wool, suit weight silk and linen work well. Please do not bring a plaid, corduroy, or velvet. Remember it is not easy to sew on black!! Please pre-steam your fabric if you have a good steam iron. It will save time in class.

For lining we recommend Ambiance rayon or Hang Free polyester or a fun printed blouse-weight fabric. Fabric Depot has all of these.

It is very important to bring a pattern that has been altered to fit you. McCall's 4598 is our current classic blazer with a notched and shawl collar option. A simple cardigan is an easier choice.

If your fabric is soft, it will need interfacings. We will give an interfacing lesson to show you how to make the right choice. Our line of PerfectFuse interfacings is carried at the Fabric Depot. If you have good shoulder pads, bring them. If not, they are in the store. You may also need my book *Jackets for Real People* to use as your course manual.

Comfortable, easy-to-change-out-of clothes. Layering allows adjustment to heat and air conditioning. Sleeves shouldn't interfere with sewing.

Sewing machine. (If you pack it in its original carton, you can check it on airplane or UPS it to Marta Alto. Bring extra bobbins, zipper foot, and needles. If you can't bring a machine, we may be able to loan you one.)

Sewing supplies: (All are available at The Fabric Depot and you get a student discount.)

- ___ Two full boxes of 1 3/8" extra-fine glass-head pins and a magnetic pin cushion
- ___ Needles (both hand and machine)
- ___ Your machine accessories including a zipper foot.
- ___ Sharp fabric shears or rotary cutter.
- ___ Thread clips or embroidery scissors, tape measure, 6" hem gauge, seam ripper, see-through
- ___ gridded plastic ruler
- ___ Tape measure

Former students recommend bringing an empty suitcase just in case you buy fabric at some of our noted fabric stores (especially if you are going on the Shop 'til You Drop trip!).
Mark your supplies with your name before class.

Also, handy is a nice hanger for your jacket.

Please do not wear perfume, as in the past we have found some students have allergies to it.

SHOP 'TIL YOU DROP FABRIC STORE TOUR

This is an optional program offered the day following the workshop. We have so many unique fabric stores—more per capita than most cities in the world. Tailoring Workshop One-day Teacher Training Schedule

2-DAYS AFTER WORKSHOP

What to wear for photography for your professional PR photo.

Do not wear makeup. Ethel will “do you” for the photo. You may choose to have Ethel do your colors at this time if time permits. She does colors BEFORE she does your makeup.

You need to wear a good fitting garment preferably in a solid color or small print. The photos are black and white. Large prints are distracting and often dated. Choose a garment similar to a style you will wear when teaching. In other words, if you will be teaching in casual clothing, wear casual clothing. Also, don't forget the accessories! We will have some accessories and extra clothing on hand, just in case we feel the garment you brought may not photograph well. It shouldn't look puckered or wrinkled. We have an iron.

- 9:00 am Meet in the hotel lobby to car pool to Pati's home. If not enough cars, we will pick you up. If you will have a car and be willing to drive, e-mail Pati for directions to her house at patipalmer@aol.com or call Pati the night before or early that morning at 294-0696 for directions.
- 9:30 am Overview of teacher training tools and supplies provided. Pati will explain slides

and you will have a chance to practice giving a slide presentation during this day. Marta doesn't use them in the workshop due to time. You will each have a chance to read the script. This presentation is a great overview of our techniques and you can use it for a free or paid seminar to promote your hands-on classes.

- 10:00 am Ethel will begin makeup and hair styling and color analysis for those wanting it. Pati will show samples of past teachers' photos.
- 12:30pm Lunch.
- 1:00 ish Make up and photography will continue.
Continue with slides or bring a jacket pattern trimmed and ready to be fitted by another teacher for practice.
- 4:00 pm Return to the hotel. Or, if you drive, you could take a side trip to Josephine's which is downtown and close to Pati's and wait for traffic to ease up at 6:00. They are open until 9:00 and there are nice restaurants nearby.
